



Wengen enjoys some of the most terrific views in Switzerland, perched on its own sunny shelf at the base of The Jungfrau. Almost entirely car-free, visitors to Wengen arrive by Alpine train meaning that the village has managed to retain a brilliant traditional and unhurried atmosphere. The hub of the village is definitely the main street, which is lined with shops and hotels. Most of the restaurants in Wengen can be found within the various hotels. Wengen is the ideal resort for those looking for a relaxing holiday with easy-going skiing, perfect for families.

Top Runs

- Despite being famous for the Lauberhorn Downhill course, easily the longest and one of the hardest in the World Cup circuit, the skiing in Wengen is actually best-suited to intermediate skiers.
- Made up of mostly long, cruisy blues and gentle reds, intermediates will enjoy the relaxed skiing in Wengen. Tougher pistes can be found by venturing to the top of the Lauberhorn chair lift. From there, head down to Kleine Scheidegg or Wixi following the start of the World Cup course.
- Novice boarders will find it easy to progress from the nursery slopes up to the gentle blue and red runs on the mountain, which are served by the train and chairlifts. For the best freeriding and some steep terrain, expert boarders should head over to Mürren.



Best for Après Ski

- **On the Rocks**
For the best cocktails in town, head to this delightful mixology bar. It also has great live music nights throughout the season.
- **Crystal Bar**
A typical English-style pub. It is a great place to enjoy live sport on the TVs.
- **Schneebar Figeler**
A delightful bar that features a curated selection of local beverages with a warm, inviting ambiance. It has stunning views of the mountains and is open daily.
- **Tanne Bar**
A small and traditional bar, with a warm interior of dark wood and comfortable chairs. Tanne Bar is loved by tourists and locals alike so expect it to get quite crowded.

Recommended Restaurants

- **The Silberhorn**
The restaurant in this hotel serves up excellent five course dinners from a varied menu.
- **Chez Meyer's Le Grand Restaurant**
Located within Hotel Regina, this is possibly the best place to eat in town, offering fabulous French cuisine and accompanied by some excellent French and Swiss wines.
- **The Bären**
Found inside the Hotel Bären. The restaurant is listed in the Michelin Guide thanks to its brilliant food and service.
- **Pizzeria Da Sina**
A good choice for a family meal out. Alongside good pizza and pasta dishes, the restaurant also serves up great fillet mignon and salmon steaks. It can get busy, so booking is recommended.
