## Our View on Kitzbühel





**Kitzbühel** is a large, Austrian town with a beautiful, medieval centre. With extensive and varied slopes, Kitzbühel is one of the big names in the ski world, largely thanks to its spectacular Hahnenkamm downhill race course – the most exciting on the World Cup circuit. There is plenty to do off the slopes and many visitors love the upscale ambience, as well as chic shops and cafes. The nightlife is vibrant and there are excellent mountain restaurants.

## **Top Runs**

- For beginners or intermediates, the Asten number 20 blue run leads directly into the resort centre and runs next to the Wolrd Cup slope.
- For experts, the best pistes and off-piste terrain are mostly concentrated in the Steinbergkogel– Ehrenbachgraben area.
- The Hahnenkamm area is prime terrain. Good intermediates will want to do the World Cup downhill run and the long blues of around 1,000m vertical to Klausen, Kirchberg and Skirast are satisfying. The black to Aschau is not difficult, and a lovely way to end the day (check the bus times first).





## Best for Après Ski

- Club Take Five
   As the biggest club in
   Kitzbühel and conveniently
   located a few moments from
   the resort centre, its the
   perfect spot for late-night
   escapades. Known for its
   swanky reputation, guests can
   expect cocktails and bubbles.
- Schialm
  A popular stop-over point with culinary delights and local brews. It has a cosy restaurant for the colder, snowy days, and a large sun terrace where the vibe cranks up around 4pm for après ski with some good music. It is a gentle ski down an easy slope back to the village.
- Pavillon
  Set just in front of the
  Hahnenkamm gondola,
  Pavillon is one of the best
  spots if you fancy a lively
  après scene.
- The Londoner
   Kitzbühel's long-established
   British pub is a great venue

## Recommended Restaurants

- The Neuwirt
   Located in the chic Schwarzer
   Adler Hotel, this is regarded
   as the best restaurant in town
   and has won awards from
   food guides. The dishes are
   imaginative and full of flavour.
- Huberbräu-Stüberl
   An old-world Tyrolean haunt with vaults and pine benches, this tavern favours substantial portions of Austrian classics, such as schnitzel, goulash and dumplings, cooked to perfection.
- Panorama Alm
   This has a beautiful, intimate interior and a great terrace with a bar and excellent food. Plus, as the name suggests, exquisite views.
